TAKING THE BUS TO THE ALC

Buses run to and from each high school (except for Salem Hills) before school, during lunch, and after school. However, buses from ALC after school, do not reach primary high schools in time for students to catch any connecting buses home. Students who normally take a bus home should choose ALC classes in our morning block or make plans for alternative transportation.

IMPORTANT ALC REGISTRATION INFORMATION

1. In order to register for ALC classes, students must first obtain permission from a parent. See below signature line for both the student and a parent. Once signatures are obtained, students will then turn in this form to their high school counselor or the ALC counselor.
2. ALC class options are discussed with the student/parent and the counselor will dual enroll the student, so ALC classes can be registered on the following timeline.
3. **ALC ONLINE REGISTRATION** – Students who are dual enrolled into ALC will be able to log onto Aspire and sign up for any ALC classes, on a first-come, first-serve basis. Classes will open in the following order:
 - **Wed. March 21st** – Seniors only
 - **Thurs. March 22nd** – Juniors & Seniors
 - **Mon. March 26th** – Sophomore registration begins by the High School or ALC Counselor only—not online
 - **Friday, April 13th** – the online ALC registration window will close to students
 - **Monday, April 16th** – From this date on, students will need to meet with the high school or the ALC to add or make changes to any ALC course. Class changes will no longer be available online to students.

UVU LIVE INTERACTIVE (DISTANCE LEARNING) FALL 2018 COURSES

Live Interactive courses are another way to earn both high school and college credit concurrently. These courses are broadcasted from UVU in real time to an ALC classroom but taught by a UVU professor. Courses fulfill G.E. and/or major requirements at most colleges and universities.

However, courses are not on the Nebo School District schedule and calendar, which makes it a little harder to fit in a normal high school A/B schedule but still very doable, especially for your senior year. These classes take up both your A/B period in a given time slot. **Please talk to our ALC counselor for information and scheduling questions.**

A SHORT DESCRIPTION OF OUR ALC PROGRAMS

AVIATION TECHNOLOGY – This blocked series gives students foundational knowledge prior to actual flight training. However, students will get virtual experience through flight simulation. Actual flight training hours, testing, and costs are separate from this program. When students have taken the full two-year program, students will be prepared for the written exam for the Ground Private Pilot’s license.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION – Students are involved in the construction of a home while being supervised by a licensed contractor. Tools are provided. Students can choose to attend either day, B day, or both. *Students must be a junior or a senior and provide their own transportation to the job site.*

BUSINESS EDUCATION – Students will learn the marketing and management principles necessary to start and operate their own business, as well as the laws that govern business. Our classes in Entrepreneurship and Business Law will help students fulfill foundation classes for the Entrepreneurship and Management Pathway.

COMPUTER INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY - Our IT program is meant for students who enjoy exploring computers and technology, learning how to repair and maintain them, as well as building a network. IT positions are wanted in every industry throughout the world. Students can earn industry certification when passing qualifying exams. These classes are part of the study of Info. Technology and allow students to complete classes in the Network & IT Support CTE pathway.

COMPUTER PROGRAMMING - This program introduces students to the world of programming, where students learn how to design and create computer programs. These classes are part of the study in Information Technology and allow students to complete the Programming/Software Development CTE pathway.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE – These classes will introduce students to the field of criminal justice and its corrections system, as well as criminal investigations, law & forensics. These classes are in the area of Law, Public Safety, Corrections & Security and allow students to fulfill classes in the CTE Protective Services pathway.

DIGITAL MEDIA – Digital Media teaches students to design and create interactive projects in graphics, animation, sound, video, and audio. We have individual classes in all of these areas. Students can earn CTE Pathways in both Digital Media and Web Development & Administration.

ENGINEERING, ARCHITECTURE & MANUFACTURING - This program introduces students to the engineering design process in order to solve problems. Students brainstorm, sketch, build, and test prototypes of their solutions. These classes are in the area of Engineering and Technology. Students are able to complete various CTE pathways like CAD Mechanical Design, Mechanical Engineering, and Robotics. New students should start with our beginning class offerings.

HEALTH SCIENCE - These classes are in the area of Health Science and can help students fulfill a variety of CTE pathways. All health science classes are for juniors and seniors.

TEACHER EDUCATION - In this two-course series, students will be involved in elementary educational experiences throughout the district. The series will include class instruction, guest speakers, visiting and observing classrooms, lesson prep and instructional experiences, and students will be prepared to engage elementary children in appropriate technology activities. *Students will need to be able to provide their own transportation between schools and be a junior or a senior.*

EARLY COLLEGE CLASSES – These courses fulfill core requirements for both high school, as well as General Education and/or major for college. Most of these courses are offered as an accelerated block in only a semester of time. Students will be expected to put in extra time outside of class in order to complete the school work required for these classes. Students interested in Nursing should take the PSY 1010/PSY1100 block. PSY 1100 is also required for elementary education majors.
